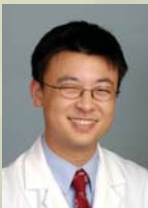

Our Department of Ophthalmology has just moved to a large, updated facility at 7400 State Line Road in Prairie Village, Kan. This new location offers easy access and abundant, convenient parking.

The new patient-friendly office has 25 streamlined exam rooms where some of the area's leading ophthalmologists, medical residents and fellows diagnose and treat a wide range of eye diseases and conditions.

The facility was designed to maximize patient comfort and care through the integration of the most advanced technology available. Built around a centralized imaging system, the design allows physicians in any exam room to immediately access patient diagnostics. Exam rooms and waiting areas are equipped with a 3-D animated communication platform that educates patients on topics specific to their diagnoses or treatments.

In addition, the office was wired with a look toward the future. It will soon be paperless, when an electronic health record system is implemented in the next few months, further enhancing communication with referring physicians.
