## *Prevention Tips:*

1. Identify each plant by common and botanical name before placing in your home or yard.
2. Before giving a plant as a gift, find out if it is poisonous.
3. Store bulbs and seeds out of reach of children.

## *First Aid Tips:*

1. Remove any plant material from the person's mouth.
2. Check mouth and tongue for redness, blisters or swelling.
3. Have syrup of ipecac available in your home.
4. CALL THE POISON CONTROL CENTER BEFORE GIVING ANY IPECAC AT HOME.

In the event of an accidental ingestion of a plant, remove any material from the mouth. Check the mouth and tongue for redness, irritation or discoloration. Rinse or wipe out the mouth with cool water, and give a glass of water. Observe for any difficulty in swallowing or excessive drooling.

Make sure there is a bottle of SYRUP OF IPECAC in your home. Check the expiration date periodically and replace it when necessary.

Know the name of all your trees, bushes and plants both outside and inside your home. Take a sample of each one to a green house or nursery and get the common and botanical name of all plants. Doing this before you have an exposure can save valuable time.

Please call the Poison Control Center on all exposures. Even non-toxic exposures may cause minor symptoms and should be evaluated for any possible problems.

ALWAYS, call the Poison Control Center before administering Syrup of Ipecac.
